

V¹⁶ FAQs

When & Where is V¹⁶?

Saturday, May 21, from 9:30am-4:30pm, at StL Gateway Church of the Nazarene | Doors open at 8:30am

Who should attend?

Everyone is welcome! The event is designed for all leaders and volunteers in the local church.

What is the purpose of V¹⁶?

V¹⁶ aims to equip leaders and volunteers from every local church to carry out the values of prayer, discipleship, leadership development, community connection, and multiplication.

What will take place at this event?

There will be an opening plenary session featuring a worship team composed of members from district churches, and a message by Dr. David Busic, General Superintendent. There will be three workshop sessions with at least six different workshops offered in each session, for a total of more than 18 workshop options. The day will close with a plenary session featuring our district worship team, a message by District Superintendent Mike Palmer, and communion together as a family.

If V¹⁶ takes the place of our NMI, NYI, and SDMI Conventions, when will voting and business take place?

There will be no “business sessions” during the day. All reports will be distributed in printed format to delegates at check-in. Elected delegates will have the opportunity to vote during the morning.

Do we still need to elect NMI, NYI, and SDMI delegates?

Yes, each church still needs to elect and send delegates for each auxiliary to V¹⁶. Each church should complete a Certificate of Election for each auxiliary and submit to the designated person.

Why are we replacing the traditional conventions with this new event?

Many local church leaders & volunteers were not able to attend the NMI and SDMI Conventions due to the fact that they were held during the work week. We are hoping that a Saturday will allow many more local church workers to attend. Combining the three auxiliaries allows us to share resources and be better stewards of our finances. It also creates synergy between missions, youth, & discipleship as we join together in worship & learning. Minimizing the business allows us to focus on inspiration, education, and connection. It will be a great time to be together with the district family!

Will District Assembly be separate from V¹⁶?

Yes. District Assembly will be held June 5-6 at the St. Louis Webster Groves Church of the Nazarene.

What will be available for my children?

Nursery care will be available for children ages birth – 4 years of age. For children 5 years – 6th grade there will be fun programming just for kids with special children’s workers. All children should be registered for V16 to allow us to be adequately staffed & equipped to care for them. All children’s staff will be screened for safety and have a current background check on file.

What is the registration cost?

Online registration is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children. Walk-up registration is \$15 for adults and \$5 for children.

Will lunch be provided?

Yes! A boxed lunch from Jason's Deli is included in the registration fee. A kid's meal from Jason's Deli is included in the children's registration fee.

When & Where can I register?

Online registration is open from March 7 – May 7. You may register by going to www.monaz.org/V16. After May 7 online registration will be closed but walk-up registrations will be accepted.

We would like to have individuals from our church register themselves online, but we would like to send in one church check for everyone. Is this possible?

It isn't possible for online registration to be completed without payment. If someone would like to register your church's delegates and workers as a group, it is possible to enter multiple individuals on one registration. This would require entering each individual's name and personal contact information, address, email, & phone, as well as answering the question of whether they will have children, birth-6th grade, attending. It is important that those with children attending complete a separate registration for their children. The easiest option might be to have individuals register themselves and then the church can reimburse them for their registration cost. Maybe cash reimbursement could be given so multiple checks wouldn't need to be cut.

Why should I register online?

We encourage online registration. This allows us to be well prepared with adequate seating, boxed lunches, and staffing ready to care for our children.

Will refunds be given for registration if I need to cancel?

Unfortunately we will not be able to give refunds.
